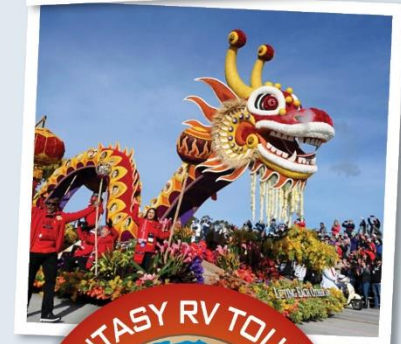
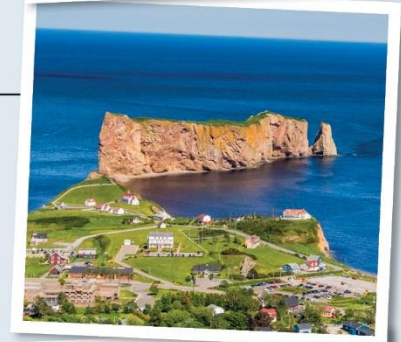
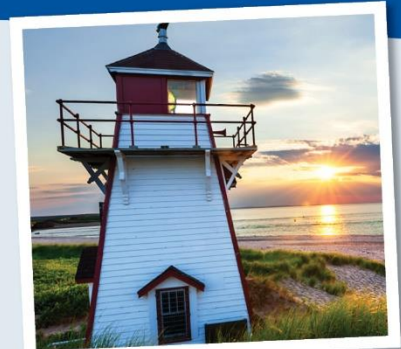

## ON-SITE EMERGENCY INFORMATION

### GLAMARAMA RALLY EVACUATION PLAN IN CASE OF INCLEMENT WEATHER OR OTHER DISASTER

Security personnel will be assigned areas of the fairgrounds to instruct rallygoers where to go for safety. All golf carts will help transport rallygoers to the north side of the coliseum building (near the Youth building), which is designated as the storm shelter/inclement weather location at the Darke County Fairground (see the blue star ★ on the map). Please refer to the map in this program book to become familiar with these important locations. **Please note: shuttle service is temporarily suspended during lightning.**

**EARLY DEPARTURE EMERGENCIES:** If an emergency requires early departure, please contact Michael Overbeck (513) 200-4349 or a rally official for assistance in exiting to avoid damage or injury to others.

**SAFETY/SECURITY:** The grounds security staff can assist in any emergency needs. Security officials, Mary Alice Gast, and her staff maintain the rules and order on the rally grounds. In an emergency and for safety concerns, contact Mary Alice at 513-594-0774 or request assistance from any rally official. They will contact Security personnel for you. Please note: for those entering or exiting the fairgrounds, all gates will be closed except gate #1 and #2 to Sweitzer Street beginning Thursday. Contract security will be on the fairgrounds from 6:00 PM until 6:00 AM, Wednesday through Sunday.

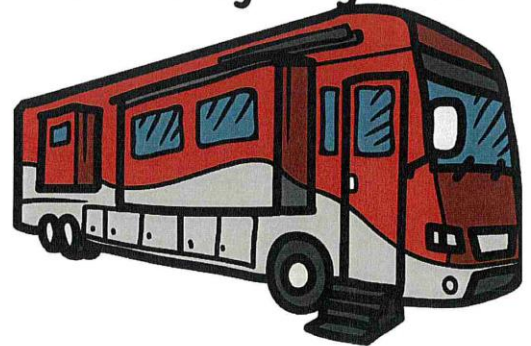

# RULES AND REGULATIONS

**BADGES:** Please display your **Rally Issued Name Badge** (credentials) at all times. If you are missing a Name Badge, please obtain one from **Rally Registration**. The name badge tells our security crew that you are a paid participant at the Rally. They will be required for the Friday ice cream social and Saturday breakfast. Tickets are required for the Anytime lunch and Ladies Luncheon.

**BEVERAGES:** The fairground does not sell alcoholic beverages. Contain the serving and consuming of alcoholic beverages within your coach and campsite.

**DETECTORS:** The use of metal detectors is not allowed on the fairground property.

**ELECTRICITY:** Please, one electrical connection per coach. No generators are permitted, and no "cheater" adapters to simulate 50-amp service are allowed.

**FIRES:** Campfires are permitted when maintained within a raised container at least six inches above the ground.

**DUMP STATIONS/EARLY DEPARTURES:** Please come to the fairgrounds with empty holding tanks. There are dump stations located on the fairgrounds if needed. Once parked, attendees may choose to use the dump stations on the fairgrounds. If early departure or a dump station is required, please request assistance. Contact Michael Overbeck (513) 200-4349 or a rally official to be guided to and from your site. Unsupervised R.V. movement may result in damage to your and others' valuable property and create a risk to those traversing the fairgrounds. Thank you for your consideration in this serious matter.

**PETS:** Pets are welcome at GLAMARAMA 2024 but must be kept in the parking areas unless they provide service assistance. Pets are not permitted in any of the fairground buildings – seminars, entertainment, morning coffee hour, etc. – or vendor/exhibit areas. Please be a responsible pet owner. Pets must be on a leash. Be considerate of others and prevent your pet from making excessive noise. Use discretion when walking your pets and **CLEAN UP AFTER THEM**.

**PRIVATE VENDING:** Items may not be sold at your coach or elsewhere on the fairgrounds.

**SEATING AT EVENING ENTERTAINMENT:** Chairs are set up to ensure good viewing for all during the evening entertainment. Special consideration is made for those with mobility devices. You are welcome to bring your own chair.

**SMOKING:** Smoking is prohibited in any of the buildings. Thank you for your adherence to this policy.

**VEHICLES: Only licensed drivers** may operate motorized vehicles and golf carts.

- **WHEN USING PERSONAL CAR,** safety is a prime concern. In areas where there are pedestrians, please keep your speed down to a walk (3 mph) and avoid any moving coaches, especially while the parking crew is directing them.
- **BE SURE THAT YOU ARE LICENSED AND INSURED:** Except for the on-duty golf cart drivers (covered by FMCA's insurance), the driver of any vehicle (coach, car, golf cart, bicycle, etc.) is responsible for having insurance should there be an accident. It is your responsibility to be sure that you are covered. Also, only licensed drivers may operate any motorized vehicle, and those vehicles must be equipped with lights between sunset and sunrise. These requirements are both the fairgrounds' policy and the policy for all FMCA sponsored events.

## RALLY SERVICES

**ANNOUNCEMENTS:** Daily announcements will be posted on a whiteboard in the Beef & Dairy Pavilion.

**ACCESS to Darke County:** Planning on visiting Darke County sites? Please see details in the Official Darke County Visitors Guide included in your Welcome Bag. You can also go to: [VisitDarkeCounty.org](https://www.visitdarkecounty.org) or call 800.504.2995.

**CHILDREN UNDER 16:** When unaccompanied, should know, or carry with them, their parents'/guardians' cell phone numbers. If you **DO NOT** want them riding the shuttles without you, use a magic marker to write the word "**NO**" across the GLAMARAMA logo on their badge.

**DISABLED ACCESS:** All of the activities at GLAMARAMA are accessible. One should be able to move around easily in a wheelchair or on a mobility scooter. If you do not see a shuttle in your Area (six-passenger golf cart), please call our dispatcher, Bob Garcia at 734.389.5159. Have the street name and your site location ready when you call. Also, have someone wait outside to flag down the cart and be prepared to go upon arrival. There are limited marked disabled car parking spots adjacent to the entertainment and seminar buildings.

**FREE EXCHANGE TABLE:** There will be a "Free Exchange Table" where rally attendees can put the things they no longer use, but are just too good to throw away. Feel free to take anything that's on the table that you think you might use. The table will be along the wall in the Beef & Dairy Pavilion where the morning coffee is served.

Periodically check the Free Exchange Table because folks are constantly adding new items. There is no obligation to contribute, so please feel free to take anything that you think you might use. Items left behind will go to Goodwill or in the trash. Please contact George or Sue Myers at 937-477-9770 or 937-272-3493 if you have any questions.

**INTERNET ACCESS:** There is no publicly available internet service on the fairgrounds.

**LOST AND FOUND:** Please turn in found items to the Registration/Information Center. Visit the kind volunteers at the rally registration desk to inquire about lost items.

**MAIL SERVICES:** Incoming and outgoing mail can be picked up and dropped off daily at the rally registration desk. Those desiring to have mail forwarded to the Rally should use the following address:

**OVERNIGHT CAMPING BEFORE THE RALLY:** Pre-rally overnight camping is permitted. A \$40.00 cash-only fee per day will be collected in the Welcome Area by clearly identified registration volunteers.

**REGISTRATION/INFORMATION CENTER:** The Registration/Information Center (Domestic Arts Tue/Wed and Youth building thereafter) is located at the rally registration desk. Rally information of all sorts is available here. The registration area is open from 2:00 PM to 5:00 PM Tuesday, 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.



## RALLY SERVICES (Continued)

**SHOWERS:** Refer to your map in the program guide for locations. The showers are designated with **R/S** on the map.

**ACTIVITY CARTS:** We have shuttle/activity carts that will patrol both the activity areas and the parking areas looking for anyone who needs a lift. The carts use the main roads, but they will come to you if they see you waving your hand above your head. The shuttles will pick up folks anywhere they find them; however, there are designated "Shuttle Stops" labeled "S.S." on your rally map. These stops are monitored and will have a "Shuttle Stop" sign and a bench. Please report any transportation problems to Bob Garcia at 734.389.5159. **Please note:** shuttle service is temporarily suspended during lightning.

**TRASH DUMPSTERS:** Dumpsters are located throughout the fairgrounds for your convenience. Trash pickup at your coach is not available. Please do not leave trash at your site upon departure. Thank you for helping keep the fairgrounds as beautiful as when you arrived.

**VENDOR COUPONS:** Each Welcome Envelope includes one vendor coupon per attendee. Feel free to combine or use them separately toward purchases from our rally vendors. Volunteers will receive an additional \$10 in vendor coupons. No change is given when using the vendor coupons. Be sure to spend the entire value of the coupon. Please give all vendors our support and thank them for being here.

## **GLAMARAMA JUNE 2024 TOURS**

Note: Only the Armstrong Air & Space Museum Tour is facilitated with pre-arranged bus transportation by GLAMA. You must have registered for the tour prior to the rally. If you are interested in attending, you can check at the registration desk to determine if there is space available. All other attractions identified below are on your own.

**Armstrong Air & Space Museum, Wapakoneta** - Have you ever dreamt of walking on the moon? Explore the wonder of space travel at the Armstrong Air & Space Museum, located at 500 Apollo Drive, Wapakoneta, OH 45895. This museum, designed to resemble a futuristic moon base, honors Ohio's rich contributions to aviation and space exploration, with a special focus on Neil Armstrong, the first man to set foot on the lunar surface.

The Armstrong Air & Space Museum offers something for every space enthusiast. Immerse yourself in history with artifacts like the actual Gemini 8 spacecraft piloted by Armstrong himself during the world's first space docking mission. Climb aboard a replica Gemini capsule, stand in awe inside a replica Apollo capsule, or gaze up at the stars in the Astro-theater. Get a glimpse of a real moon rock collected on Apollo 11 and marvel at Neil Armstrong's spacesuits worn on his historic missions. Exhibits cover the history of flight from the Wright Brothers' pioneering flights to the Space Shuttle era, showcasing Ohio's vital role in this incredible journey.

Whether you're a lifelong space buff or simply curious about humanity's quest to reach for the stars, the Armstrong Air & Space Museum promises an out-of-this-world experience. With its focus on honoring Ohio's contribution to aviation and space exploration and commemorating a truly iconic Ohioan, Neil Armstrong, whose "one small step for a man" was indeed a "giant leap for mankind." Discover the story of the Treaty of Greenville and how it opened the door to the Northwest Territory, shaping the course of American history. Delve into the life of legendary sharpshooter Annie Oakley, who was born and raised in these very parts. The museum is the largest in the county, filled with fascinating details and artifacts that will leave you spellbound. **National Museum of the US Air Force, Wright-Patterson AFB (near Dayton)** – Prepare to be overwhelmed by the incredible offerings of the world's largest military aviation museum! Since 1923, this Dayton-based museum has evolved from a small engineering study collection to a renowned center for air and space power technology and culture preservation. The museum's vast galleries feature a stunning array of rare and one-of-a-kind aircraft and aerospace vehicles, as well as thousands of historical items that trace the evolution of military flight from the Wright brothers to today's stealth aircraft. Sensory-rich exhibits, complete with mannequins, artifacts, sound effects, and theatrical lighting, contextualize the aircraft and bring history to life by dramatizing and personalizing the events depicted. Visitors can explore multiple galleries that focus on the various eras of military aviation and Air Force history, including the Early Years, World War I, World War II, Korea, Southeast Asia, the Cold War, Flying the President, Research and Development, Global Reach, and Space. With 20 indoor acres and additional outdoor Air and Memorial Parks that continue to grow each year, the museum's offerings are almost too much to see! Don't miss out on this unique opportunity to explore the incredible world of military aviation and Air Force history. 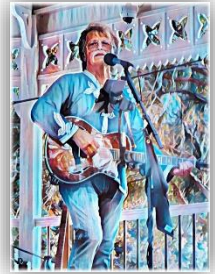

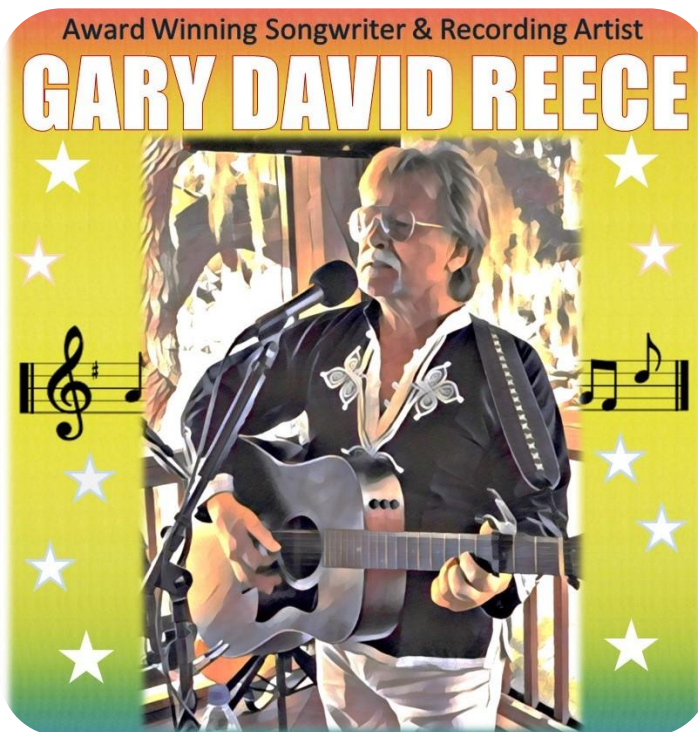

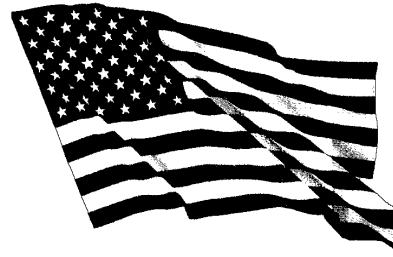

# MOTORHOME CHECKLIST

*Before setting out for that all-important trip, review this checklist to help prevent unpleasant and costly repairs.*

## CHASSIS SYSTEM

- Check that the fluid levels are in operating range (oil, power steering, engine coolant, windshield washer, transmission, brake fluid if equipped, etc.).
- Check chassis engine starting battery for clean connections and proper state of charge.
- Check operation of all lights and flashers.
- Check horn operation.
- Prior to trip, start engine and check all gauges for proper operation.
- Check for proper operation of foot brake and parking brake.
- Check wheel lugs for proper tightness.
- Check and set tire pressure according to actual axle load.

## GENERATOR

- Check for cleanliness of the generator as it affects efficiency.
- Service the air cleaner as required by the owners manual.
- Check oil level and change as required by the owners manual.
- Check generator starting battery for clean connections and proper state of charge.
- Keep governor and choke linkage clean.
- Check manufacturer's owners manual to ensure proper maintenance has been performed.

## REFRIGERATOR

- Operate refrigerator on gas and look at burner to see if flame is blue. If it is not, have repairs performed.
- Check to ensure there are no obstructions in ventilation system.
- Check to see that control knobs are not stripped and causing a false thermostat reading.
- When packing the refrigerator, do not pack so tightly as to shut off internal airflow.

## AIR CONDITIONING

- Check air filters and clean if necessary. Look to see if cooling unit coils are clean and free of debris.
- Check to see that condensing unit is clean, free of obstructions, and that nothing is blocking airflow.
- Check voltage at outside panel. Most air-conditioning systems are designed to operate at 120 volts plus or minus 10% (108-132 volts).

## INSIDE THE COACH

- Turn off the water pump switch.
- Close windows and vents.
- Check that cabinet doors and drawers are closed.
- Check that refrigerator door is fastened.
- Check that no heavy items are stored in overhead cabinets.
- Check that countertops, range top, table tops, and shelves are clear of unsecured items.
- Where are the fire extinguisher(s) and are they fully charged?
- Check that smoke, carbon monoxide, and LP-gas detectors are installed and working properly.

## ITEMS YOU MAY WANT TO BRING ALONG

- Adequate supply of prescription medicines and copies of prescriptions.
- Prescription sunglasses and eyeglass prescription.
- Camera and video camera.
- Stationery and stamps.
- Address book with telephone list.
- Reading material.
- Spare chassis parts, set of engine drive and accessory belts, fuel filters, oil, highway flares, light bulbs, fuses, and 12-volt trouble light with cord.
- Accurate tire pressure gauge.
- Spare parts for generator (spark plugs, oil, air filter).
- Emergency items: first-aid kit, heating pad, ice bag.
- Special pet supplies.
- Extra toilet chemicals and toilet paper.
- Maps.

## THOUGHTS TO CONSIDER

- Be sure motorhome insurance is current and you have a current insurance card and vehicle registration with you.
- Avoid carrying a great deal of cash while traveling: Use travelers checks and credit cards.
- Confirm any reservations well in advance.
- Make a clothing checklist.
- Secure home and valuables before leaving.
- Discontinue appropriate home services, mail, and newspaper delivery.
- Notify neighbors and police of departure and return dates.

## COLD WEATHER OPERATION

- LP-gas appliances, furnace, and gas operation of refrigerator are designed with sealed combustion areas. This is for safety to prevent danger from carbon monoxide or depletion of oxygen. If frost or condensation accumulates in closets or cabinets during long periods of cold-weather operation, leave doors to these areas ajar to provide air circulation.
- Be sure kitchen and roof vents are open when using oven or burners.

## IF TOWING A CAR WITH A TOW BAR

- Is the tow bar hooked up and checked?
- Are the safety chains crossed under the coupling and hooked?
- Are the towed vehicle's lights working?
- Is the transmission in the proper gear?
- Is the driveshaft disengaged if need be?
- Is the towed vehicle's parking brake off?
- Is the ignition in the first ON position?
- Do you have a spare set of keys for the towed vehicle? If yes, lock the towed vehicle.
- Do not attempt to back up when hooked up! Remember, you are driving a vehicle that is 20 feet longer!

## JUST BEFORE DRIVING AWAY

- Disconnect and stow electrical cord, sewer hose, and water hose.
- Check TV antenna to ensure it is in the retracted position.
- For safety's sake, turn off the propane, or have a device to shut off the tank in case a rapid leak occurs.
- Check to ensure that items inside compartments are secure and the compartments are properly secured/locked.
- Are the leveling jacks in the raised position?
- Is the awning(s) up and secured?
- Is the slideout(s) ready for travel?
- Is the doorstep retracted?
- Is the outside door locked from the inside?
- Are the rearview mirrors and driver's seat adjusted properly?
- Is your campsite clean?
- Is everyone buckled up? **FMC**

## **Did You Know?**

More of us are bringing motorized transportation to rallies and conventions to help us move between seminars, vendors, entertainment, and our parked coaches. These golf carts, Crickets™, scooters, etc. are a wonderful convenience for many of us who are not as mobile as we used to be.

Using these vehicles in close proximity to all of the pedestrian traffic poses increased risk of an accident for which you may be found responsible. Many owners of these vehicles may not be aware that they do not have insurance to protect them in case of an accident. These vehicles may not automatically be covered under your homeowners or motor vehicle policies. Your insurance company may consider these types of vehicles as “recreational vehicles” or “motor vehicles” and require that they be separately insured with an additional premium. You may be able to purchase insurance coverage for these vehicles with an attachment (called a “rider”) to one of your existing insurance policies. Several companies will cover a small, single seat electric scooter used to transport a disabled person under a homeowners policy.

For your protection, and the protection of other attendees at our rallies and conventions, you need to ask your insurance agent whether your vehicle is covered under an existing policy, or will you need to secure additional coverage.
